Red Panda likes to read so much that her nickname is "Red Reader." Red likes to help others learn to read too.




Blu is Red Panda's cousin. Blu asks Red, "Please teach me how to read."



Red answers, "I'm happy to teach you. All around us are signs. Signs mean something. This sign means stop!"




Red continues, "When we talk we make sounds. The sounds have meanings. Letters stand for different sounds."




They sing the 'A,B,C' song together. Red continues, "There are two types of letters: uppercase and lowercase."

u blue




Sometimes "y" is a vowel too like in the words: try fly sky.




Blu guesses, "sometimes vowels don't say their names. They make other sounds." "Yup!" said Red.

Red explains, "Vowels can join together to make even more sounds too. For example:"


ea eat

Red replies, "Yes, This is called a 'rule.' Rules help us read. But these rules have breakers. For example:"




Red shows, "Letters can join together to make new sounds too."





This is a little confusing but with practice you will get it.


Red smiles, "Now let's put letters together to make words." Blu holds the words. Red helps him sound them out.

This is an example.


Past - was

Future - will be




Blu also learns to add an "s" to mean more than one. Book becomes books.




Blu can now read by himself! He likes to read!

"Reading is like having magic keys that unlock doors to the wide world of learning. Let the adventures begin. Read on!"








